LADY ANN SALEEM Lady Ann Salem is a journalist and documentary filmmaker. She served as executive



director of Tudla Productions, a group that produced newsreels and social documentaries. She is one of the founders of online publication Manila Today and served as its editor since 2014. She is also IAWRT's Communication officer since 2019. She was arrested on December 10, 2020 on planted evidence and police trumped-up charges, and was released after almost three months in jail when the court threw out the cases against her. After her release, She headed the establishment of IAWRT Philippines' Digital Safe House in 2021. The government continued to appeal the cases against her and these cases were

dismissed by the Philippines' Court of Appeals in September 2023.
